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Headteacher's news:

This week we have enjoyed visits from our new Reception starters (and parents) and the rest of the children in school visited their new classroom for September and to spend some time with their new teacher. Our new teachers (Mr Dring Y3/4 Cedar) and Mrs Amos (Y5 Oak) were able to attend for the day which was great. Mr Kyriacou's new class were unable to meet him so Mr Bentham met with the new Y4 Beech. We will find some time next week for Mr Kyriacou to spend some time with this class.

Thursday was a very busy day. In the morning, I had a meeting with governors to formalise that Jessica O'Hanlon will take on the role of Chair of Governors with immediate effect.
