Headteacher's news:

I hope Issue 1 of Rufford Park Post finds you and your families well and that you have had a good summer. It was great to welcome the children back into school on Monday and I, personally, have enjoyed getting back into a normal routine. Holidays are great but I think that we enjoy them all the more when we have had a sustained period of hard work preceding them. The end of summer term was certainly indicative of this with Ofsted's visit in the final week. I have received the draft report from our inspection and expect to be able to share the final published version next week.

On Wednesday the teachers enjoyed opening up the doors before and after school for informal drop-ins - a chance for parents and carers to see classrooms and meet the staff. It has been exciting watching the new climbing frame being installed this week on the KS1 playground. Mostly funded by the Friends Of Rufford Park (FORP), we expect this new structure to enhance playtimes and lunchtimes for the children. Like the KS2 trim trails, we are unable to supervise its use before or after school and, once the climbing frame is opened, children using it during these times will need to be closely supervised by an adult and school will not be able to take any responsibility for accidents that might occur.

And finally ... we ended the week with the very sad news about the death of Queen Elizabeth II. I briefly spoke to the children about it in assembly this morning and we await further guidance about any possible disruption to the school in the coming days.
