

Headteacher's news:

I was very sad to have had to close another bubble over the weekend and have missed Y4 Beech as well as the children self-isolating from Y5/6 Ash this week. Fingers crossed we don't get any more cases between now and the end of the school year. As we edge ever closer to Step 4 of the road map, the DfE has produced new operational guidance for schools. Part of this information states that from 16 August, children under the age of 18 will not need to self-isolate when informed they are a close contact of a positive case. This means that we will not need to close class bubbles (we might not even have these) from September. This will significantly reduce any further disruption to children's education.

On Thursday the children enjoyed our 'behind closed doors' sports day. Children from Nursery to Year 6 took part and competed against each other in 4 teams. Events included a straight sprint, hopping race, sack race, egg and spoon and beanbag on head. All our pupils thoroughly enjoyed their events and showed some excellent enthusiasm and sporting behaviour by cheering others on and offering encouragement to others. The scores were incredibly close all day with Denmark running out as overall winners!

A big well done to all involved - especially Mr Spence for organising the event. It was great to have this important event back on our school calendar!
